World

- No Sunday Blue Laws
- Increased roles of leadership
- Increased technology is positive and negative

- Global society, international influences
- Need to accept change and learn about other ethnic groups
- Liberal vs. Conservative

Church

- Increased role of women in leadership roles in church
- More inclusive instead of divisive
- Church was dependent on women to get church stuff done
- Allow contemporary music, relaxed services
- Broader global religious world views and exposure to other faith systems
- Fewer baptisms/no baby boom/church is not the norm
- Divisions in Christianity
- Freedom to question/inquiring heart
